The Learning Program[™]

In September of 2015, DSAWM launched the first session of The Learning Program (TLP) in Michigan. TLP teaches parents how to put research-backed teaching methods into practice and empowers them to serve as capable advocates for their children in the educational process. DSAWM's pilot Learning Program is at capacity, serving 12 students ages 4-7 and their parents. The program will expand in 2016.

The Learning Program is funded by a \$10,000 education grant from The Global Down Syndrome Foundation and generous support from guests at the 2015 Winners Cup Benefit.

Financial Support for Families

DSAWM disbursed more than \$17,000 in financial assistance to families for therapy, adaptive devices and meal vouchers. We saw a sharp increase in requests for Adoption Assistance, providing \$7,500 to four west Michigan families adopting a child with Down syndrome - historically, DSAWM received an average of one request per year. It is exciting to help more couples give a child with Down syndrome a forever family!

Bike Camps


Riding a bike provides a self-sufficient means of transportation to school, work and social activities; fosters independence; and promotes self-confidence and an active lifestyle. In 2015 DSAWM offered it's second iCan Bike Camp and again the camp ran at full capacity of 40 campers with Down syndrome and other disabilities. 75% of campers left riding standard two wheeled bicycles!

iCan Bike Camp was funded by a community grant from the Grand Rapids Jaycees Foundation.


